These teaching and learning expectations reflect our school's definition of high-quality teaching for <u>ALL</u> students.

Themes	How?
Adults facilitate learning	 including 80% student engagement: 20% teacher talk in the majority of lessons planning well-structured sequenced lessons that build on prior learning having high expectations of all pupils using adaptive teaching to meet the needs of all pupils, particularly the lowest 20% using a range of questioning styles to assess understanding stopping lessons at key points to check understanding expert modelling that is visible throughout the lesson working with different groups of children throughout the week to ensure quality-first teaching for all appropriate intervention by peers and adults to move on learning ensuring that all adults are deployed effectively and are actively engaged with the children providing opportunities for focused discussions
Learners are supported to be independent	 using the environment around them (working walls) to access previous learning using resources to support their learning accessing 'Stuck? Finished?' prompts clear links to previous learning through recaps/flashbacks taking responsibility for their own learning through knowledge of next step targets being encouraged to ask for support when needed giving developed answers in full sentences
Classrooms are organised	 so that resources are accessible to all & independence is encouraged with visual prompts and resources to support emotional regulation tidily and with muted colours to avoid overstimulation without hanging displays & distractions around the whiteboard
There is a positive climate for learning	 with a calm and purposeful atmosphere where children are engaged in learning where there is mutual respect where all contributions are valued
Adults give meaningful feedback	 is in the moment to have maximum impact immediately addresses individual, group and whole class misconceptions – even in the middle of an activity extends children's answers to stretch and challenge shows high expectations of all pupils enables self and peer assessment
